

Charles Nelson AIA, LFRAIA, AECPM

I am an American architect with a half-century of diversified experience, and moved to Australia in 1984 with my Australian wife, Jennifer Fall.

I've had some lucky breaks that have allowed me to work with over 300 design firms on ISO 9001 systems over 15 years. From that grew the opportunity to author a book: *TQM and ISO 9000 for Architects and Designers* (McGraw-Hill, 1996). That, in turn, led to being considered (by a few impressionable souls) as an "authority" on the application of ISO 9001 to the design professions.

From that recognition came the opportunity to author quality management sections in the American Institute of Architects' *Architect's Handbook of Professional Practice*, 13th edition, and its *Update 2003*. It also led to becoming editor and principal author of *Managing Quality in Architecture: A Handbook for Creators of the Built Environment*, published in 2006 (Elsevier).

Professional service: I was honoured to serve on the American Institute of Architects Practice Management Advisory Group 1999-2004, was the 2003 Chair, and edited its electronic newsletter in 2004.

Along the way, I've written several continuing education programs, including its Risk Management course, for the Royal Australian Institute of Architects Education Division, and served as chair of the Professional Development Committee, RAIA Victorian Chapter.

I also had the chance to author the *CHECKIT!* series of project quality control guides, published by the RAIA, and used by architects throughout Australia for the past quarter century. As a result, I was asked to advise the Design Professionals Insurance Company (now XL), the second largest US architect/engineer insurer, on adapting its risk management training programs to comply with ISO 9001.

Quality Systems: All that turned into a lot of training; I have presented over 100 full-day workshops on quality management over the past 25 years, and many conference seminars on risk management, project management, strategic alliances and design management. And I have presented workshops on design and construction quality management at 12 annual American Institute of Architects National Conventions. Project Management: A lifetime of managing design and construction projects has resulted in training hundreds of Australian, New Zealand, Japanese and US design practices to improve their project management and quality control skills.

That experience, plus the writing, put me in position to manage an intensive program to build design process management expertise in Japan's largest real estate developer group, Mitsui Real Estate. This project, extending over 2001 and continuing through 2002-2003, involved the re-thinking and the complete rebuilding of Mitsui's project procurement and delivery systems. It was a fantastic learning experience, as much for me as for the people I worked with.

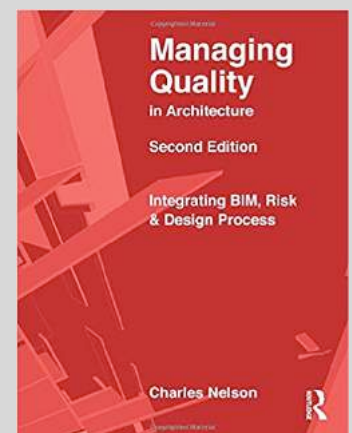


What I do

In addition to the activities noted at left, in my **PSMJ Resources** role I help design firms rethink and improve their business development activities, including their branding, websites, promotion and presentation skills.

I often facilitate strategic planning retreats, and sometimes work in an "Executive Advisor" role, across the full spectrum of firm management issues.

All of my work is directly connected to the overall theme of Rethinking how to practice, and putting in place solutions that build on my clients' present realities to get them to their preferred futures.



This assignment grew to include the re-positioning of Mitsui's condominium marketing program, and the development of a new brand strategy for Mitsui, based on new concepts in ensuring project quality.

Currently, I am Managing Director of Melbourne-based Building Technology Pty. Ltd., representing Boston-based PSMJ Resources, Inc. in the Asia-Pacific region, trading as PSMJ Resources Australasia. In this role, I provide training in Project Management and related design topics, as well as senior-level consulting in mergers and acquisitions.

I've served as the Technical Editor of PSMJ's *Project Management* newsletter, and I write many of the articles for this and other PSMJ publications.

Some other recent projects include:

- Development of a project management training program for Japanese project managers, to introduce them to Western approaches to project management;
- Management of an Australian acquisitions program for an international design consortium;
- Several years as Senior Advisor to Tokyo-based PM/CM Japan KK;
- Executive Advisor to four design practices in Perth, Melbourne and Auckland; and
- Advisor to Bangalore & Singapore-based Space Matrix – the fastest growing design office in Asia, on its development of an ERM type practice management software system that they intend to commercialise.

Project management software: Over the past five years, I have worked to develop new approaches to automating project management functions for design practices.

I have been trained in the UK *Prince2* project management method, and certified to the *Prince2* Foundation level. In 2006, I was deeply honoured as a Life Fellow of the Australian Institute of Architects for my many years of contribution to the society.

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UNOPS Planning Manual

One of the greatest honours I have ever had was learning that CHECKIT, together with tools from my *Managing Quality in Architecture* book, has been adopted by the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS).

In 2016, it was rolled out as part of UNOPS' *Design Planning Manual for Buildings*, and is now in use by over 1500 designers working with UNOPS worldwide.
